SHAPING OUR CORRIDORS





The City of Charleston is undertaking an update to its Zoning Code called **Setting New Standards**. The purpose is to modernize the regulations that govern development in the City, to make them more user-friendly, address the goals of the recently adopted *Charleston City Plan*, address rising water levels that impact current and future development, and ensure the updated regulations treat all members of the community equitably.

A Code Assessment completed in April 2024 evaluates how current regulations align with City goals. The assessment suggests Form-Based Districts be considered for key corridors, to shape future development according to the goals of City Plan. Form-Based Districts are an approach to zoning that prioritize context and urban form over land uses, and can be used to implement a specific vision. Charrette meetings this summer will gather input on potential districts for corridors in West Ashley and Johns Island. **Plan to attend and provide your input so the new code standards will match the community vision!** West Ashley
